

The management curriculum provides the foundation for careers in supervision and general management in a wide variety of organizations. It develops skills in management practice through an understanding of general management principles, individual and group behavior, organizational change and design and human resources management.

I. Required Proficiencies

A minimum level of proficiency must be demonstrated in foreign language or regional expertise. New freshmen and transfer students should meet this requirement within the first year of enrollment as dictated by the number of courses required. Students who fail to complete this requirement within the first year of enrollment may have to extend their program beyond the 120 semester hours required for the degree. Students can satisfy the requirement as described below:

Foreign Language – Satisfy either by 1) two years in high school of a single foreign language* or 2) completion of second level competency of a single discipline at the college level. (Example: Spanish 1, Spanish 2)

*High school waiver does not equate to academic credits.

Regional expertise – Business students can satisfy their foreign language requirement by successful completion of three college level courses (9 semester hours) approved by the Business School. These courses will focus on a region of the world and will emphasize that region's art, history, philosophy, geography and/or political structure. The region should be an area of the world other than Canada or the United States. Courses taken to meet this requirement cannot be used to satisfy any other core requirement. With the successful completion of one year of High School Foreign Language, of a single discipline, only six hours of Regional Expertise are required. With the successful completion of one college semester of a single discipline, only six hours of Regional Expertise are required.
