1. Proposed Faculty Assembly Structure Models for UCD

a. The Chancellor wants some kind of structure soon regarding recognition and authority rules.

i. Model I-

1. Model I brings faculty and interaction with the chancellor
2. Faculty council reports directly to the Regent/s if things need to be changed
3. This model puts the Provost back in charge of academics, research, libraries
4. ADDED SLID: Another potential model that stresses "joint governance" focusing on Anschutz and Auraria Campus regarding oversight of the two budgets collaborating.
 - a. Anschutz budget is based on clinical learning. The schools are not involved. There is a need to look at the University of Colorado's budget
 - i. Single source of private funding recognition.
5. The problem with added potential Model I is that the Faculty want to be able to directly communicate with the Chancellor

ii. Model II-

1. Executive assembly meets with the Provost on a regular basis who then goes to the Chancellor
 - a. This model lists current committees and no vice chancellors making the distinction between where and how each interface of each committee is established
 - b. The Provost decides which issues to take to the Chancellor
 - c. More like a filtered process
 - d. Model II may seem like a less efficient model

iii. Model III-

1. Model III encompasses preservation of identity with the use of faculty assembly
2. The dotted lines show balance of representation
3. Does not show a main purpose of getting UCD involved with clinical affairs
4. Research at Anschutz is different in that without grants UCH will fail while the downtown campus can survive
5. Relative Priorities:

- a. Undergraduate students are not the primary focus at Anschutz
 - b. There is an overlap with BS and Graduate schools
 - c. 50% of UCD was graduate student based
 - d. Research will become a major area of UCD
 - e. UCD will eventually bring in a heavier faculty line with funds being raised without state help
 - f. Tuition and research are going to become the only funds available
 - g. The market is going to be involved in multidisciplinary programs
 - h. Visions need to become more of a partnership
 - i. 75% of courses on the Denver campus are taught by researchers
 - j. Clinical proposals may support PHD services
 - k. This model proposes a joint clinical and academic union
2. The faculty feel that Model I and III are the only real efficient models
 3. Model I and III require maintaining the voice and building a faculty that cannot be dismissive

Leslies Model: Administration Merged Campus Structure

1. This structure requires participation and represents all committee's uniting versus forming an executive committee so that together the faculties can understand each departments concerns
2. Structural caveats- members from each assembly would represent at each meeting
3. 1, 1.5, or 2 meetings is the intermittent
4. Recognizing goals and asking questions about which model helps developing positive and negative feedback
5. The model has to be passed by both faculty assemblies
