## 1 STUDENT COMMONS BUILDING

This building is a hub for many of CU Denver's student services—from the Center for Access and Engagement, CUE&A, the Office of Admissions, and the Office of International Affairs. You'll also find Lynx Central, which is your first stop for all things financial aid, billing, and enrollment. There are also outdoor common areas to catch up with friends and indoor spaces to relax, hang out, or study—like Speer Gallery, which is decked out with mind-bending art by Volkan Alkanoglu and plenty of seating.



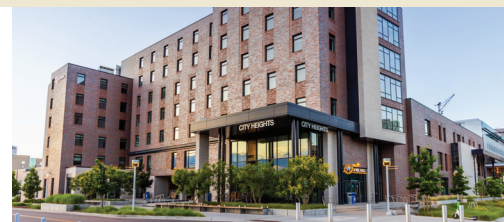
## 2 LOLA & ROB SALAZAR STUDENT WELLNESS CENTER

This is more than a state-of-the-art gym and fitness facility with a 38-foot climbing wall, six-lane pool, three indoor basketball courts, and group fitness classes. This building also boasts a gaming lounge, nap rooms, and study spaces. Students can make use of mental health and basic needs resources, like Milo's Market food pantry and Loving Lynx, which can help students who are experiencing an immediate financial crisis. Want to get outside? Students can check out adventure gear rentals or join organized trips.



## 3 CITY HEIGHTS RESIDENCE HALL

This award-winning facility houses more than 550 students and features a brand-new dining hall. It is in the center of campus and close to buzzing downtown Denver. Many students who live here are part of Living Learning Communities, a valuable opportunity for first-year or transfer students to build community. It's also connected to your next stop, the Learning Commons.



## 4 LEARNING COMMONS

In this centrally located building, you'll find the Learning Resources Center, where students can access peer tutoring, individual coaching resources, the Writing Center, and more. With private workspaces and group meeting rooms, there are plenty of options for quality studying and collaboration on projects.



## 5 TIVOLI QUAD

Here, you can relax and enjoy the views of downtown Denver and the Rocky Mountains. It's the perfect place to spread out a blanket for studying, enjoy lunch with a friend, or toss a frisbee between classes. The Tivoli Quad is our largest greenspace and is shared with our friendly neighbors, Metropolitan State University and the Community College of Denver. Our university is part of the larger Auraria Campus—the nation's only tri-institutional campus.



## 6 TIVOLI STUDENT UNION

Originally built as a brewery in 1870, the Tivoli Student Union now serves as a landmark and hub for Auraria Campus activities and services. This historic building is home to many essential resources including the bookstore, campus ID station, hangout spaces, the LGBTQ+ Student Resource Center, the Student and Community Counseling Center, and the Office of Student Life. You'll also find many other campus services here, including your next stop—LynxConnect.



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## LYNXCONNECT IN TIVOLI STUDENT UNION

LynxConnect houses our Career Center, Experiential Learning Center, and Study Abroad office. This means you can walk into this one-stop-shop and get help aligning your major to your chosen career path, as well as help with writing a cover letter, tips for building your resume, and assistance practicing for interviews. The staff will also connect you to internship opportunities and help you figure out your study abroad plans.



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## PLAZA BUILDING

Here, you'll find the Health Center at Auraria, which provides medical and mental health services to the students of Auraria campus' three institutions. Some of their offerings include flu shots at no charge, physical examinations, acute illness care, and X-rays. They also offer telehealth services for a variety of healthcare appointments.



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## EMMANUEL GALLERY

The Emmanuel Gallery is Denver's oldest religious structure, but today, it serves as a dynamic art gallery that showcases the creations of students, faculty, and renowned artists from around the world. The Emmanuel is home to events throughout the year that celebrate and elevate Denver's vibrant arts scene and catalyze community engagement with inspiring creative works.



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## ARTS BUILDING

The Arts Building houses CU Denver's College of Arts & Media (CAM). CAM focuses on degree programs that prepare students for careers in visual arts and the music, film, and television industries. For those interested in music performance, there are professional recording studios in this building.



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## AURARIA LIBRARY

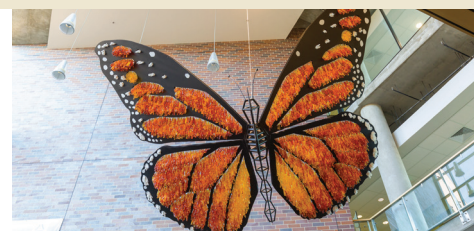
The Auraria Library is a central hub for study spaces, research and scholarly resources, computer labs, tech equipment, and more. Designed by the acclaimed architect Helmut Jahn, it is also an important architectural landmark in Denver. Don't miss the Innovation Garage where students can use resources like a 3D printer, Cricut Maker, sewing machines, and more.



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## SCIENCE BUILDING

Students take classes in Chemistry, Biology, Math, Anthropology, and more in our Science Building. This building is a shared Auraria Campus space, with most CU Denver labs located on the second and third floors. You'll also find the Intermission Café in this building—a great place to grab coffee or a snack. Can you find the giant butterfly here? It's a sculpture, made out of test tubes, by artist Donald Lipski.



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## NORTH CLASSROOM

Welcome to the North Classroom, which houses the College of Engineering, Design and Computing (CEDC), as well as the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (CLAS). Lecture halls, specialized labs like the Active Cyber Infrastructure Defense Lab (ACID Lab) and the Trimble Technology Lab, classrooms, and computer rooms are all located in this building.



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## CU DENVER BUILDING

The CU Denver Building is home to the College of Architecture and Planning (CAP) and many classrooms. CAP is the only school in Colorado that offers NAAB-accredited degrees in architecture, as well as degrees in landscape architecture and urban planning. The first floor also houses the Inworks 3D prototyping lab, where students, faculty, and community partners collaborate to design, prototype, and test innovative ideas. While envisioning the cities and structures of the future, students take inspiration from the breathtaking views of the Rocky Mountains and downtown Denver.



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## LAWRENCE STREET CENTER

This building houses classes for the School of Education & Human Development (SEHD) and other schools and colleges. It's also the location of the Terrace Room, where many major campus events are held, and the DNVR Coffee Co., where you can refuel with a tea or latte between classes. And it's the home of CU Denver's University Honors and Leadership Program, an application-based program that empowers students with leadership skill development, scholarship support, and discussion-based courses designed to help them solve complex social challenges.



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## BUSINESS SCHOOL

The CU Denver Business School routinely places among the top 5% of business schools in the world. All Business School classes, programs, centers, faculty, and staff are located in this building, with many computer labs, study rooms, and advising offices available to help students succeed in their chosen career fields. The building recently underwent a \$20 million renovation and features the J.P. Morgan Center for Commodities—an area that simulates a commodity-trading environment.
